



Annual Reports—2015 and 2016

Summary

We were incorporated in October 2014 and started getting referrals in January 2015.

We have

- Determined eligibility on at least 43 individuals referred for diagnostic and/or living expenses.
- Served a total 36 of those individuals with financial assistance spending \$31,728, or an average of \$881 an individual.
 - Provided emergency financial assistance to 8 of these individuals for a total of \$4,527, or an average of \$566 each.
 - Provided financial assistance for diagnostic testing, tooth extraction, nutrients, care tender assistance, or other types of medically-related services to 28 these individuals for a total of \$27,201, or an average of \$971 each.

The greater financial need is for funding for all types of medically-related services such as diagnostic testing, tooth extraction, nutrients, care-tender assistance. Although when individuals require emergency financial assistance, we have provided a substantial amount of funds to them.

From our first donation in 2015 through 2016, we received \$55,784. The money came as a result of local fundraisers, grants, memorials, or gifts. Our charity is totally a volunteer organization. The only expenses not related to financial assistance for individuals included corporate taxes and insurance (administrative expenses)—\$3,394 or 6% of our income, which means that 94% of our funds were available to provide financial assistance to potential cancer patients or to cancer patients.

2016

- Determined eligibility on 27 individuals referred for diagnostic and/or living expenses
- Served total 20 of those individuals with financial assistance, spending \$19,262, or an average of \$963 an individual. Seven individuals found other means of securing financial assistance
 - Provided emergency financial assistance to 3 of these individuals for a total of \$2,488, or an average of \$829 each
 - Provided financial assistance for diagnostic testing, tooth extraction, nutrients, care tender assistance, or other types of medically-related services to 17 of these individuals for a total of \$16,774, or an average of \$987 each
 - Diagnosed 16 or 80% with cancer and referred them for treatment—4 individuals were happy to find out that their symptoms were negative for cancer.

Thirty-nine mostly female employees of the Putnam County School District attended a workshop on ovarian and uterine/endometrial cancer sponsored by Putnam First Cancer Fund.

Two-hundred faculty, students, parents and families attended a Breast Cancer Workshop during the Crescent City Jr/Sr High School open house sponsored by Putnam First Cancer Fund. Breast Cancer survivors acted as a panel of experts in concert with Dr. Kuruvilla providing the medical overview.

In 2016, we received \$29,287. The money came as a result of local fundraisers, grants, memorials, or gifts. Our charity is totally a volunteer organization. The only expenses not related to financial assistance for individuals included corporate taxes and insurance—\$1,679 or 6% of our income, which means that 94% of our funds were available to provide financial assistance to potential cancer patients or to cancer patients.

2015

- Served a total of 16 individuals with financial assistance spending \$12,466, or an average of \$779 an individual

- Provided emergency financial assistance to 5 of these individuals for a total of \$2,039, or an average of \$408 each
- Provided financial assistance for diagnostic testing, tooth extraction, nutrients, care tender assistance, or other types of medically-related services to 11 of these individuals for a total of \$10,427, or an average of \$948 each

In 2015, we received \$26,497. The money came as a result of local fundraisers, grants, memorials, or gifts. Our charity is totally a volunteer organization. The only expenses not related to financial assistance for individuals included corporate taxes and insurance—\$1,715 or 6% of our income, which means that 94% of our funds were available to provide financial assistance to potential cancer patients or to cancer patients.
